Dear Members and Friends of West Union Baptist Church,

Pentecost is a powerful reminder that we serve a living God who keeps His promises. Fifty days after the resurrection of Christ, the Holy Spirit came in power, filling the hearts of believers and birthing the New Testament Church. That moment in the Upper Room was not just for the early disciples—it was for every believer who would call on the name of the Lord, including you and me today. Acts 2 tells us, "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind... And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost." The Spirit did not come quietly—He came to empower, to equip, and to ignite a fire in the hearts of God's people. That same Holy Spirit is available to us now. Acts 1:8 declares, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me..." Pentecost turns ordinary people into powerful witnesses. It takes our weakness and fills it with God's strength so that we can boldly proclaim the Gospel in our families, neighborhoods, and even to the ends of the earth. In a time when many hearts are troubled and the world is searching for answers, the Church must rise with Pentecost power—unashamed, unafraid, and unmovable. We are not to retreat in fear but advance in faith, trusting that the Spirit who came like fire and wind is still working in us and through us.

Let us be a church that is alive with the Spirit—worshiping in truth, walking in love, and working with purpose. Let us be known not for programs or performances, but for the power and presence of God among us. In this Pentecost season, may your heart be stirred, your soul refreshed, and your spirit empowered. The wind of God is still blowing—let us lift our sails and follow His lead.
